Dear Ms. Boyd,

There has been some preliminary contact between Duke Energy, my mother and myself however no substantive disability accommodations have been offered to us.

My mother and I now both have medical health emergencies resulting from or exacerbated by exposure to Duke's EMF-emitting electric meters as approved by the PSC. We are requesting PSC approval (at least on an interim basis pending resolution) for immediate replacement of existing EMF-emitting meters and installation of two electromechanical analog meters with no radio capabilities and no radio frequency emissions. We have in our possession two satisfactory electromechanical meters, calibrated and certified for accuracy, which can be placed by Duke Energy or a licensed electrician.

Therefore, I object to any postponement of the hearing date (as requested by Duke) unless we can get immediate relief.
