Answers to Procedural Questions Propounded by South Carolina Solar Business Alliance (“SBA”)

CHIEF HEARING OFFICER’S ACTION:

The South Carolina Solar Business Alliance (“SBA”) filed an inquiry about the logistics of the Virtual Forum to be held in these Dockets on October 6, 2020. SBA asks about the duration of the forum. Unfortunately, this is difficult to impossible to tell without knowing precisely the length of the oral comments to be presented. The following answers other inquiries of SBA. The planned format for the forum is that a moderator will call on each entity that wishes to be heard to present their comments. There will be no specific time limit set on the length of each presentation, however, the Chief Hearing Officer would urge each presenter to be concise, but to still take whatever reasonable time is necessary to express a viewpoint. There will not be a presentation on behalf of the Commission. Lastly, Commissioners are not expected to attend and/or participate in the forum. I trust this is helpful information.
