**Order Holding All Deadlines in Abeyance and Granting Two Phase Approach**

**SUBJECT:**

DOCKET NO. 2019-326-E - South Carolina Energy Freedom Act (House Bill 3659) Proceeding to Address S.C. Code Ann. Section 58-27-460(A)(1) and S.C. Code Ann. Section 58-27-460(A)(2) (Promulgation and Periodic Review of Standards for Interconnection and Parallel Operation of Generating Facilities to an Electrical Utility's Distribution and Transmission System) - Staff Presents for Commission Consideration the Joint Request of Duke Energy Carolinas, LLC, Duke Energy Progress, LLC, Dominion Energy South Carolina, Incorporated, South Carolina Solar Business Alliance, Incorporated, and Southern Current, LLC to Hold Procedural Schedule in Abeyance.

**COMMISSION ACTION:**

On September 15, 2020, the Interested Parties filed a joint request asking the Commission (1) to hold in abeyance all deadlines in this Docket and (2) to permit the Interested Parties to implement the requirements of SC Code Section 58-27-460 as amended in a two-phased approach in this Docket.

The Interested Parties are Duke Energy Carolinas, LLC ("DEC"), Duke Energy Progress, LLC ("DEP"), Dominion Energy South Carolina, Inc. ("DESC"), the South Carolina Solar Business Alliance, Inc. ("SBA"), and Southern Current, LLC ("Southern Current").

These Interested Parties have advised the Commission that they need additional time for discussion to reach a regarding queue reform of the South Carolina Generator Interconnection Procedures.

I move that the Commission grant the request of the Interested Parties to hold all deadlines in abeyance, including the hearing date, and for the Commission to engage in an Two-Phase Approach regarding its periodic review of the standards for interconnection and parallel operation of generating facilities to an electrical utility's distribution and transmission system. The first phase will be a review of queue reform and the second phase will involve parts of the South Carolina Generator Interconnection Procedures.

The Clerk's Office of the Commission is directed to hold all deadlines in abeyance for this Docket.

I also move that the Interested Parties are directed to provide an update to the Commission on their progress related to suggested revisions to the South Carolina Generator Interconnection Procedures no later than by the close of business on November 30, 2020.
